Please read through this carefully as it has some changes from last year. All choir members will be held to the highest standards in both academics and conduct. Please be aware that by signing and returning these forms, you acknowledge and agree to abide by the contents of this handbook. These forms will also serve as the first assignment and must be returned by Friday, August 31st. You may submit online from the website, follow the QR Code on the schedule or print the form and send it in.

I have attached a calendar of the dates of events that I know of thus far. I will keep you updated as other events arise and they will also be posted in the room. I will also be using Remind, the website, Facebook and Twitter to send out any reminders that you need to be aware of. You will find more information about it in this handbook. Grading Policy:

GRADES ARE BASED ON THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Attendance: All members must attend *all required* functions!
- 2. Conduct and personal appearance for public performances, especially in uniform
- 3. Rehearsal techniques
- 4. Singing tests in groups of 4, 6, or 8, Individual recordings during rehearsals, listening tests, ect.
- 5. Written tests and assignments

Quarter Grade Breakdown:

300 Points -Performance Attendance: Attendance is expected of all students for required concerts and rehearsals. Unexcused absences from a rehearsal or performance will receive 100 points for rehearsal and 300 for performance, and will be deducted from their overall grade. Missing a performance may result in a drop in a letter grade for choir, which may make the student ineligible for extracurricular events. Furthermore if a student is tardy, this will result in a penalty. Call times are typically 30 minutes before the concerts, so students and parents must plan accordingly. Students who are not in full uniform or fail to have good conduct during performances will also have points deducted.

10 Points - Daily Participation Grade: Participation grades will be given each day to reflect the student's work during rehearsal and regular classroom activities. Attendance and tardies will be considered since the student cannot participate if he or she is not present. Tardies are also considered if the student does not have music, pencil or other required materials for rehearsals. Students may only have <u>5 excused in class absences</u> with makeup credit eligibility. Posture, vocal technique, preparedness, organization, participation and attitude are also included in the daily grade points.

50-100 Points- Tests, Quizzes and Written Work: Written assignments will be given throughout the school year, including but not limited to semester exams, quizzes, singing tests, or other written work over the material being taught in class. Excused in class absences and excused performance or rehearsals will be given a written assignment to make up for that grade. This will be determined between the director and the student.

Attendance Policy:

Since choir is a performance- based class, it is imperative that all students be present and on time for every event. For this reason Washington Choir has a very strict attendance policy. If a rehearsal or performance is missed, and the absence unexcused, points will be deducted from your grade. If you are absent, it is YOUR responsibility to see the director about a possible make-up assignment.

For an absence to be excused a phone call or written note from a parent or guardian is required at <u>least 24 hours</u> before the performance/rehearsal (for emergencies, a note is required after).

A student's absence not only affects oneself, but also the entire ensemble! Make sure that you compare your choir calendar with other events to avoid conflicts!!!

Excused Absences:

- 1. Extreme illness (required note from doctor or parent)
- 2. Death or funeral of a relative or close friend
- 3. Family emergencies

If you are involved in a conflicting school- sponsored activity, it is your responsibility to try to resolve the conflict on your own. If it is still unresolved, notify the director at <u>least one week</u> in advance.

Unexcused Absences:

- 1. Work
- 2. Personal Trips
- 3. Non-emergency doctor/dentist visits
- 4. All other absences not listed under "excused absences" at the director's discretion.

Eligibility:

Choir students are expected to be exemplary students both musically and academically. Passing grades should be maintained in ALL CLASSES in order to be eligible for extracurricular activities and performances. Please keep in mind that if you fail a class, you are ineligible to attend competitions/contest performances as well as due to grades, attendance or discipline issues. We will follow all MSHSAA rules when it comes to performing.

Uniforms:

All choir students will be supplied with a uniform at the beginning of the school year. Students are expected to take pristine care of their uniforms, and students will be charged a fee for a choir t-shirt. Choir member's robes will be worn during most major performances.

What is worn under the robes is also important and failure to comply with the concert attire will result in point deductions.

MEN:

Black dress pants (<u>no jeans</u>) Choir T-Shirt or Washington T-Shirt Black socks Black shoes (No tennis shoes)

WOMEN:

Choir T-shirt or Washington T-Shirt
Black knee length skirt or black pants (no jeans)
Black <u>closed toed</u> shoes (preferably flat shoes)
No obvious jewelry

Concert Choir:

Men and Women: We will be wearing tuxes and dresses as we have in the past. New members will be required to pay their fee at the beginning of the year. We will be going through Wedding Creations for rental and/or purchasing of the outfits. Returning members may wear the same outfit.

*Payment plans are also available. *
Further information will be sent home in the following weeks.

Communication:

I will be using an application called Remind, to send out additional reminders of events and assignments. Each choir has their own code that students and parents may send through text or email, to begin receiving these reminders. I will share these codes to the students during the first week of school and at open house to parents. These pages feature frequent updates to all events. As always, I am available by phone and email as well.

Classroom Expectations:

- Treat others with respect at all times and you can be expected to be treated the same from others.
- Use attentive listening while others are speaking, not talking, interrupting, or ignoring, while looking and listening with our whole selves.
- Cellphones are to not be seen or used during class periods or concerts.
- Treat yourself, others and all property with words and actions that exhibit kindness.
- Give your best effort in every class and situation.
- Gum, food and drink, except for water, is not allowed.

Discipline:

If a student commits any disciplinary infraction of the choir, school, or district rules, he or she may face many penalties, including the deduction of grades, loss of privileges and/or leadership positions, choir reassignment, and dismissal. Depending on the severity of the infraction, the director reserves the right to skip to a stronger consequence. The punishments may include, but are not limited to:

First Infraction: Warning and loss of participation points for the day.

Second Infraction: Loss of points and parent phone call.

Third Infraction: Office referral and parent contact/conference. **Fourth Infraction**: Office referral and potential dismissal from choir.
